Introducing Our Juror/Judge for 2020

Lyn Asselta has been involved in fine art and fine craft for the past 25 years. Her extensive backgrounds has included elementary school art teacher, draftsman, calligrapher, workshop instructor, and creator of awardwinning fine-art gourd vessels.

At one point, she opened an old box of Grumbacher pastels and never looked back. Pastel, as a medium, seems to be a perfect metaphor for her relationship to landscapes... vibrant, expressive, exuberant and tactile; pastel allows Lyn to hold a piece of color in her hand and to capture the essence of the wild, untouched beauty she finds in the world.

Lyn is a Signature Member of the Pastel Society of America (PSA), an International Association of Pastel Societies (IAPS) Eminent Pastelist, a member of the Salmagundi Club, the Eastern League of Professional Artists and American Women Artists. She is the founder of the First Coast Pastel Society (FL) and is a Member of Excellence of the Southeastern Pastel Society. Her award winning paintings have appeared in shows and exhibitions throughout the United States, and in invitational exhibitions in France and China. In 2009, Lyn had the honor of being an Artist in Residence for the National Park Service at Acadia National Park in Maine. Her work was featured in the February 2016 issue of Pastel Journal magazine and her painting "Blue Morning, Crescent Beach" appeared on its cover. She has also been featured in Pratique des Arts magazine and Plein Air magazine. In 2018, Lyn published her first book, Seeing the Landscape,

a collection of her paintings and prose. Lyn travels extensively to teach both studio and plein air pastel landscape workshops.

Now living in a small town in midcoast Maine after 35 years in Florida, Lyn is inspired daily by new landscapes and changes of season. Her work is represented by Cutter & Cutter Fine Art, St. Augustine and Ponte Vedra, FL, and by Gleason Fine Art Gallery in Boothbay Harbor, Maine.

News of Our Members

Shoshanna Ahart, Ahart Atelier, Am Graben 34, 85072 D-Eichstaett, Germany. Here in Eichstaett (Bavaria), Germany we too are confined to our homes except for groceries, banking and medical emergencies. People are to distance themselves from one another and keep about 5 feet apart --say in the bank or the grocery store. Although the governor of Bavaria has encouraged people to get out and excercise alone -- walking, running, biking, hiking etc. People may exerrcise with one other person from the same household. For example, my husband and I did get out and go hiking this afternoon, which was very relaxing. Eichstaett sits in the center of one of Germany's largest nature preserves (the Altmuehltal) and we are able

within minutes to hike into the woods or up onto bluffs overlooking the Altmuehl river and it's valley.

As for my own artwork, I am painting. At this time I am allowed to go outdoors to paint. I started a pastel on March 20 in a park just 5 minutes from our house. No one bothered me, but a cellist set up his instrument in the main pavilion at the back of the park and played his cello for almost two hours. It was wonderful to paint with the beautiful music in the background. I returned yesterday to the park to finish the pastel and then worked a bit more on it in my studio this morning. My studio is in our house, which is convenient. I am attaching photos of the pastel after day one in the park and finished.





I have also been doing watercolor sketches regularly indoors--sort of a visual journal. I equate it to zen meditation and find it very calming. (attaching two of those too!)





The sketchbook is small, but I have wonderful light in my studio and my cat likes to be with me while I work, which helps. I am also taking this *gift of time that we have been given* to try to slow down and attend to some things that I have put aside for quite awhile--in particular, re-designing my webite. I am also taking a look at art books from my collection--ones that I've purchased in the last year or so, but never "had time" to really sit and study--to gain new perspectives/inspiration/knowledge.

I teach painting at the university here in Eichstaett, but the university is closed and I don't know yet what the plan is for the summer semester, which is supposed to begin on April 20th. Normally I would teach a plein-air landscape course. I sent out an email to some of my students saying the following:

Artists are very fortunate because as long as we have a pencil and paper we can create. It is hard for all of us to distance ourselves from one another and remain at home, but each of you has the power of creativity to help you during this time. Pick up a pencil or a brush and draw or paint...sketch, whatever resources you have at home can help you pass the time and ease the stress.

I do think that as Artists, we are fortunate because we can't "retire" or get fired...we can always create as long as we want to. I hope that all of us can use the gift of time to be inspired and to be creative in whatever we choose to do. The cellist in the park was an amazing example to me of finding strength and beauty in these challenging times.

May each of us find a sparkle of joy in each day. My best regards to you and all the members of DPS.

My husband and I find a walk along the Mississippi River levee a refreshing escape. The ships and tugs along the river are interesting to watch. My husband worked his way thru college working on ships so he provides a running commentary of how things work on the water. The egrets and ducks are beautiful and I suspect they will be finding their way into some of my paintings soon. Perhaps this slower pace will turn out to be a blessing in disguise forcing us to slow down, smell the flowers and see life in a new way.

Darlene Johnson's pastel "Woods" received an award in the Terrebonne Fine Art Guild. Juror/Judge Michael Williams, Professor of Art, Nicholls State University. As I stay in self quarantine, I have time to finish projects, paint and watch art videos. One of my projects that I have always wanted to do, was to change the dust covers on the back of paintings in my collection. I only see how bad the paper has become on the backs of the paintings when I dust them.

My next challenge, trying all the new techniques that I have learned from workshop teachers. This has been exciting and such an eye opener to me. So many projects!

I escape the scary news at dinner time, serving food on china, having candlelight, music, flowers and lets not forget the champagne/ wine. Now the world has become beautiful again and I am recharged to paint.

Dawn Koetting's pastel "Resplendent" received one of two Best Use of Pastel awards at the Terrebonne Fine Arts Guild Spring Show. Also, a plein air piece entitled "The Bend" received a second place award. Dawn has escaped to the Hill Country of Texas to paint bluebonnets while practicing strict social distancing - by miles and miles!

Cosette Kosiba reports that she live in Florida, near Sarasota in a Del Webb community designed for people 55 and older. We know of one resident who tested positive for COVID 19 and subsequently died. It is a difficult time for everyone. I find it challenging to walk the fine line between panic & prudence. In a previous life, I spent 35 years as a registered nurse, the last ten in infection control. So, I have a great deal of respect for infectious & communicable diseases. Still, this makes it no easier to deal with the restrictions or the consequences.

I have a painting in transit to Sedona headed to an exhibit that was cancelled. The two woman show I was a part of in Sarasota scheduled for April/May has been postponed. I couldn't bring myself to stand before the easel for over a month. Then, it occurred to me just how freeing all of this was. All too often I forget that painting is about the process, not the outcome. I found myself working without any extrinsic motivation, painting just for the love of it. It is the only thing that so concentrates my mind, focuses my attention that I loose track of time. It is one of the few things that makes my heart sing.

I'm certain I'm not alone in this feeling. We are so fortunate as artists to have this refuge. Here's what's on my easel ... I think I'll call it "Distancing".

So I have all these pastels that Richesons entrusted me with for the FL palette and no students to sell them to. Bless my workshop students in AL that wanted to forge-ahead and learn, since we were a small group, and we dubbed ourselves the "Pandemic Painting Pals" as we painted all day and gathered for dinner and discussions at night It fed our souls and helped us escape

all the bad news whirling around us. If we can lose ourselves in our work, it can be the best mental salve to get us thru this.
